Ministers, Heads of Delegation, Representatives of the European Union, distinguished guests, ladies and gentlemen,

On behalf of the organisers: the EU Commission, DG Information Society and the Slovenian Government I welcome you to the European Ministerial Conference "Information Society - Connecting Europe". I am very glad to see that so many participants are taking part at this conference. This indicates that the issues that we are going to address during this conference are important for the future development of our societies.
